The foundation of this collaboration was laid during the visit of Dr. P. R. Swarup, Director General CIDC & Member Secretary ECI, to Tanzania in February 2025.










During this visit, Dr. Swarup held extensive discussions with the leadership of ERB, the Ministry of Works, and academic institutions across Tanzania. These interactions paved the way for a shared vision to promote mutual learning, professional exchange, and the creation of Centres of Excellence for training and skilling. The momentum generated by this engagement led to a reciprocal visit by an ERB delegation to India in April 2025, where the delegates met with Indian industry leaders, academic institutions, and policymakers. This visit further deepened the mutual understanding between the two nations and laid the groundwork for establishing formal institutional frameworks for collaboration.

A major milestone in this partnership was the drafting and formalization of the Memorandum of Intent (MoI) and subsequently the Mutual Recognition Agreement (MRA) between CIDC and ERB. The meticulous efforts of Mr. Praveen Tiwari, Director - Strategy & International Affairs, CIDC, and Er. Bernard Kavishe, Registrar, ERB, along with Er. Jamhuri Msabila ( Acting Registrar, ERB ) played a pivotal role in conceptualizing and structuring these agreements. Their sustained engagement and coordination ensured that the documents reflected the shared aspirations of both organizations. The leadership and encouragement of Er. Meyne David Manga, Chairman, ERB, and the proactive involvement of Adv. Mercy Jilala, Acting Registrar, ERB, were instrumental in strengthening the partnership and steering the agreements toward effective implementation.












